



CSABA LENTNER (1962, Pápa, Hungary), full professor, Dr. habil, CSc, PhD, CPA Finances & Accounting, is head of the Public Finances Research Institute at the Faculty of Political Sciences and Administration of the National University of Public Service.

He is a member of the Future Research Committee of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences and vice-president of the Association of Management and Scientific Societies. He has been visiting professor and research fellow in Cambridge, at the Sorbonne University in Paris, at Minzu University in Beijing, in the Bank of England, in the FedCenter in Washington, as well as at Zhitomir University in Ukraine. Csaba Lentner is a private professor of the University of Kaposvár, and honorary professor of Szent István University in Gödöllő.

He was graduated at the Budapest University of Economics in 1989. He acquired a university doctorate degree in 1991, as well as passed exams to become an auditor and tax advisor. In 1995 he was awarded by a candidate's degree in economic sciences at the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. His habilitation in public finances took place in 2003. In 2013, he was given the Wekerle Sándor Scientific Lifetime Achievement Award for putting the new type of finances practice in a scientific system and his school-building activity. In 2018, he received the Officers' Cross of the Hungarian Order of Merit state award as recognition of his diverse academic teaching and publishing work for the development of Hungarian finance and economics.
